



Grant **Story**

USD 239 - Every Student Matters

USD 239 received a grant from the Community Foundation to purchase chess sets and other board games to encourage students to engage in activities they normally wouldn't be involved in.

With this grant they have been able to hold weekly events for students during eighth period as well as after school.

The activities room is a place where students can meet other students with similar interests. This funding has allowed students to have a place they can go and feel supported. These connected relationships carry over into the classroom

and there has been an increased positive attitude towards school work because they feel they have a place they belong.

Since starting the program, there has also been an increase in high school students participating in extracurricular activities with 26 more participating in one school extracurricular activity and 11 more involved in more than one activity outside classroom time.

Due to school budget constraints, this program would not have been possible without the funding from the Ottawa County Community Foundation.




Total Grants and Scholarships awarded since inception




